As we close this decade, the Forum for Family Planning and Development is proud of its accomplishments for 2019.

At the national level, The Forum continues to be active in advocating for adequate budget for health as a member of the Alternative Budget Initiative (ABI). Members of ABI continue to engage legislators for budget support for RH and passage of RH-related policies in both houses of congress. Forum is also proud to have provided an active role in the passage of the Safe Public Spaces Act or Bawal ang Bastos Act of 2019 (Republic Act No. 11313). Forum provided technical assistance and served as resource person during the interpellation of the measure in the Senate. The Forum is also active in the advocacy for the passage of the Teen Pregnancy Prevention Bill and the Bill Addressing Child, Early Forced Marriages (CEFM) with Forum's Eminent Person as principal author Rep. Edcel Lagman in the House of Representatives and Sen. Risa Hontiveros for the Senate version.

Forum is once again the CSO partner of the Department of Health and NEDA/POPCOM for the conduct of the 3rd National Family Planning Conference. With support from the SULONG RH project supported by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, we have began preparations for the conduct of the family planning conference to be held in March 2020 in Novotel Hotel in Quezon City.

We are also pleased to have secured a grant from the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) in partnership with the Philippine Legislators Committee on Population and Development (PLCPD) to conduct a series of academic lectures in recognition of Forum's Eminent Persons. The first Executive Lecture features our beloved Mr. Washington Sycip who passed away in April, 2017.

Working with partner organizations from national and local government and civil society organizations including youth groups, I'd like to think that our combined efforts have contributed to improve the lives of Filipinos particularly in our project areas of Albay, Benguet, Cebu, Ifugao and Palawan. The local policies that we have advocated including the local RH and HIV/AIDS ordinances as well as increased local budget for health will directly affect a population of more than 5 million in the provinces mentioned. On a national scale, I'd like to believe that the national policies we supported will benefit Filipinos for years to come.

Advancing our sexual and reproductive health rights

Sustaining Advocacy for Reproductive Health



The Forum continues its advocacy for sustainable and appropriately funded programs for reproductive health and population and development.

The Forum is a member of the Health Cluster of the Alternative Budget Initiative (ABI), an alliance of civil society organizations (CSOs) involved in budget advocacy work. Members of ABI continue to engage legislators for budget support for RH and passage of RH-related policies in both Houses of Congress. Forum is also proud to have provided an active role in the passage of Republic Act No. 11313 or the Safe Public Spaces Act or Bawal ang Bastos Act of 2019. Forum had been involved in consultations with the office of Sen. Risa Hontiveros from the drafting, conduct of committee hearings and public consultations.



Forum also provided technical assistance and served as resource person during the interpellation of the measure in the Senate. The Forum is also active in the advocacy for the passage of the Teen Pregnancy Prevention Bill and the Bill against Child, Early Forced Marriages (CEFM) with Forum's Eminent Person Cong. Edcel Lagman as principal author in the House of Representatives and Sen. Risa Hontiveros for the Senate version.

Building Capacities of Partners

Sub-granting to CSOs

The Forum continued to support CSOs by providing grants to national and local NGOs under the SULONG RH (Sustained Local and National Advocacy for RH) project supported by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation. The grant was used by partner NGOs in implementing national and local level advocacy activities. These NGOs are Health Action Information Network (HAIN), Philippine Legislators Committee on Population and Development, Inc. (PLCPD), Filipino Free Thinkers, Gayon LGBT Organization of Albay, Roots of Health (Ugat ng Kalusugan) of Palawan, and Bisdak Pride of Cebu.



Support to LGU Partners

Committed to strengthen partnerships with the LGUs, the Forum continued to provide technical assistance to our local government partners in the provinces of Albay, Benguet, Cebu, Ifugao and Palawan for their initiatives in promoting reproductive health. These activities include conduct of forums and trainings for Barangay Health Workers (BHWs), RH seminar of Sangguniang Kabataan (SKs), Buntis / Couples Congress and Youth / Adolescent Congress.

The Forum also provides technical assistance during RH Council meetings and provides capacity building activities CSO and LGU personnel. A series of Adolescent Reproductive Health forums in the project areas conducted in partnership with LGUs and NGO

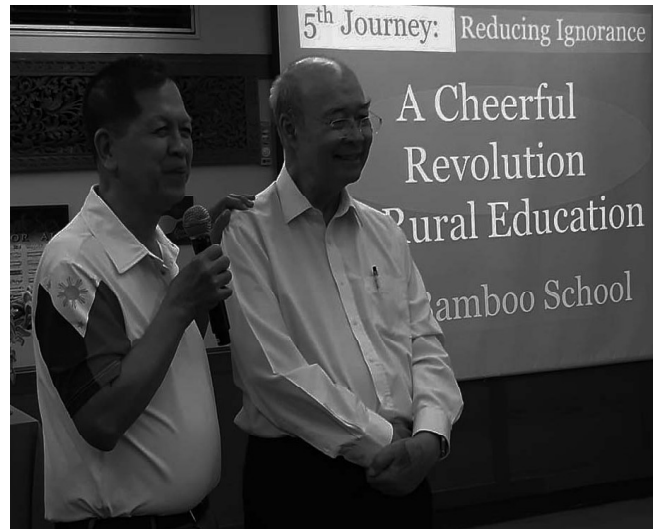

Learning Visit to Bangkok, Thailand

The SULONG RH national and local partners had its year-end review, planning workshop and learning exchange in Bangkok, Thailand last March 4-8, 2019. Bangkok, Thailand was as an area to visit because there was a time when Philippines and Thailand had the same demographic scenario and the HIV/AIDS situation in Thailand was worse than Philippines. But through multi-stakeholder cooperation, advocacy and political determination, Thailand has manage to bring down its population growth rate and manage the rate of new infection for HIV.

The group was with the Forum's President, and Trustees NEDA USec. Mike de la Rosa and Dr. Alex Herrin. The group participated in a seminar with experts from Philippines and Thailand.




Presenters were Dr. Wassana Im-em of UNFPA Thailand, Dr. Alex Herrin and Dr. Rosalia Sciortino Sumaryono of SEA Junction. The group also different organizations in Bangkok involved in sexual and reproductive health rights advocacy such as Y-Peer Asia Pacific, AIDS Access Foundation, and Thai Red Cross AIDS Research Center.

Highlight of the visit was a meeting with Thailand's foremost RH champion Mechai

Viravaidya. "Mr. Condom" as he is also known is a former Senator of Thailand and recipient of many awards for his development work including the 1994 Ramon Magsaysay Award. He is founder and chairperson of Population and Community Development Association, Mechai Viravaidya. Out of these meetings and dialogues, the participants were able to gain insights and strategies that could be replucated in their programs and projects.





Support to Partners in Difficult Circumstances

Forum also provided aid and assistance to victims of flashfloods and landslides in Tiwi, Albay and support to social and medical mission by local partners in Albay last January 2019. In addition, we distributed more than 2,000 pairs of slippers to all project sites, which was sponsored by Tukod Foundation. Working with health workers and SK opened us to more realities in our project sites. The Forum staff met with very young brides belonging to tribes of Palaw'on and Tao't Bato. The Forum facilitated health assistance to teenage moms and assisted in health missions to these communities in Rizal and Bataraza, in Palawan.

Awareness Raising for Advocacy

Social Media Activities

The Forum Facebook page has reached a milestone of getting over 4,000 likes and is being followed by 4,429 people. In November 2019, it reached 23,729 audiences and over 2,000 engagements were recorded. Most of our audiences are active from 3:00p.m. to 6:00a.m. which may be interpreted as Facebook activities by young people during these hours. The page gets a number of queries about family planning methods and where to get them.

Executive Legacy Lecture Series

In 2019, through the support of the United Nations Population Fund and in partnership with the Philippine Legislators' Committee on Population and Development (PLCPD), The Forum led the conduct of academic lectures in the name of esteemed experts and public figures in the country. On June 28, 2019, the first in a series of Executive Lectures, began with The Washington Sycip Memorial Legacy Lecture at the JV del Rosario Hall, Asian Institute of Management Conference Center, Makati City. The event provided a venue for key people in the education sector to discuss ideas that will influence policies on education that empowers women, girls, and men.



Mr. Sycip is a titan in the business and education sectors – having founded two of the more recognizable institutions in the country: the first business school in the region, the Asian Institute of Management (AIM) and the country's most successful accounting firm SGV & Company. He is also among the Eminent Persons of The Forum. He passed away on October 7, 2017.



The Keynote Message was prepared by Hon. Leonor Mirasol Magtolis-Briones, Secretary of the Department of Education (DepEd). Sec. Briones is an academic, economist, and civil servant. She is also professor emeritus at the National College of Public Administration & Governance (NCPAG), University of the Philippines – Diliman. She is a former Presidential Adviser for Social Development. Sec. Briones was ably represented by Dr. Maria Corazon Dumalo, DepEd Central Office School Health Division Chief.

The first reactor is Dr. Jaime Aristotle Alip. He is the Founder, Chairman, and Managing Director of the Center for Agriculture and Rural Development Mutuality Reinforcing Institution (CARD MRI). Dr. Alip shared that through the support Mr. Sycip, CARD MRI which started with 20 pesos and an old typewriter now operates with 55 billion pesos in 1570 municipalities, covering 40,000 barangays. They have 65 million Filipino microfinance clients and 26 million Filipinos insured under their micro-insurance programs. These people also receive assistance in their health and education.

The second reactor is Dr. Milwida Martin Guevara, President of Synergeia Foundation, which mission is to enable every Filipino child to complete a good elementary education. Dr. Guevara shared how Washington Sycip came up to her and asked how she and her NGO would like to be helped. When Dr. Guevara said that Sycip's goodwill and expression of support would be good, the latter said: "Stop that crap. How about I give you 10million pesos to help you start up?" Synergeia started with 6 municipal mayors. Now, heads of 472 municipalities join them in their advocacy.

The third reactor is Adora Mendoza, a child's rights, health, and education advocate. Ms. Mendoza is a child of the slums. She was sponsored by World Vision and now she is an inspiration speaker, life coach and mentor, and author of the book *#AdoraQuotes* and *The 8 Practical Fundamentals of Success*.

Networking and Partnership Building

Partnerships in National Events



The Forum supported the Youth Sustainability Convergence organized by SDSN Youth Philippines, one of the biggest youth gatherings which happened this year in Baguio City. The Forum had 6 breakout sessions on SRHR, one of which was Ms. Samira Gutoc as resource speaker. We supported 3 youth scholars from Ifugao, Cebu and Albay to the youth gathering.

The Forum was the only NGO partner of the 2nd Philippine World Contraception Day which was held in Zamboanga City last September 26, 2019. It also supported the Philippine Nurses Convention where our Program Associate, Mr. Kevin de Vera was a plenary speaker on the topic “Nurses and the RPRH Law” before 2,500 nurses from all over the country.

3rd National Family Planning Conference

The Forum has been requested by the Commission on Population and Development to convene the 3rd National Family Planning Conference on March 18-20, 2020 in Manila, as it has done for the first two NFPCs. This conference is co-organized by NEDA, DOH, POPCOM and The Forum. The theme is “Forging Partnerships and Renewing Commitments to Achieve Zero Unmet Need for Modern Family Planning.”

We have organized the committees for this purpose notably the Steering and Scientific Committees. Topics have been identified by the Scientific Committee. The Forum which serves as the secretariat and conference coordinator is now in the process of identifying speakers and finalizing the program flow. Suffice it is to say that NEDA Socio-Economic Planning Secretary Ernesto Pernia will be the keynote speaker.



Participation in International Meetings

52nd Session UN Commission on Population and Development (UNCPD) held on April 1-5, 2019 in New York. Forum President Benjamin de Leon attended as a member of the Philippine delegation. Other members include NEDA Socio-Economic Planning Secretary Dr. Ernesto Pernia, Commission on Population (POPCOM) Executive Director and NEDA UnderSecretary. Dr. Juan Antonio Perez III and members of civil society organizations.



Women Deliver Conference, a biennial assembly of women's rights activists and advocates from all over the world. Canada played host to this event held in Vancouver from June 3-6, 2019. Through the support of the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, Forum Director for Programs and Advocacy, Chi Laigo Vallido and Forum President Benjamin de Leon were able to attend.

ICPD@25 – Forum was also able to attend the 25th ICPD held in Nairobi, Kenya. Joining Benjamin de Leon and Chi Laigo Vallido is Forum's media consultant Diana Mendoza. The trip was also supported by the Gates Foundation. Forum was also able to meet with Riley Glandon of the Gates Foundation. Sec. Ernesto Pernia was head on the Philippines delegation and he also read the country commitment of the Philippines to the Programme of Action of the ICPD. A side event in the conference was the launching of the Rafael M. Salas autobiography book launch initiated by POPCOM.



Organizational Development

PCNC Accreditation

To further strengthen the institutional capacity of the organization, Forum applied for passed the accreditation to the Philippine Council for NGO Certification (PCNC). The PCNC accreditation certifies the Forum with a “donee institution status” which exempts donors from being taxed by Bureau of Internal Revenue (B.I.R.) The certification is the NGO equivalent to LGU’s seal of good governance. Forum is also an accredited NGO of Quezon City.



PRC Accreditation

The Forum is also an accredited training provider of the Philippines Regulatory Commission for Nurses. This means that the trainings that Forum provides for nurses will now earn them an equivalent Continuing Professional Development (CPD) Units which is a requirement for the renewal of their licenses. This PRC accreditation will also enable Forum to charge a minimum amount for trainings that are not sponsored or funded and can be an income generating endeavor of the organization.

Social Media Page Promotion

The Forum has been increasing promotion of activities using it’s website and Facebook page. In 2019, the Forum Facebook page has reached over 4,000 Likes and is being followed by 4,429 people. In November 2019, it reached 23,729 and over 2,000 engagements were recorded. Fundraising through the 12th Rafael M. Salas Cup

The 12th Rafael M. Salas Cup was held on November 8, 2019 in Camp Aguinaldo Golf Club. This year's theme is "Early Pregnancy (Teenage Pregnancy), A National Concern". It was participated by 60 avid golfers. An educational video on teenage pregnancy produced by PLCPD and video about Rafael M. Salas by POPCOM were shown.

This year's golf game was able to raise more than Php1,550,780.25. The half a million loss is attributed to reduced donations, sponsors who sent their regrets, and decreased number of players.

Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of The Forum for Family Planning and Development, Inc. (the Organization), which comprise the statements of assets, liabilities and fund balance as at December 31, 2019 and 2018, and the statements of revenue and expenses, statements of changes in fund balance and statements of cash flows for the years then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Organization as at December 31, 2019 and 2018, and its financial performance and its cash flows for the years then ended in accordance with Philippine Financial Reporting Standards for Small Entities (PFRS for SEs).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with Philippine Standards on Auditing (PSAs). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section of our report. We are independent of the Organization in accordance with the Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants in the Philippines (Code of Ethics) together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements in the Philippines, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with PFRS for SEs, and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

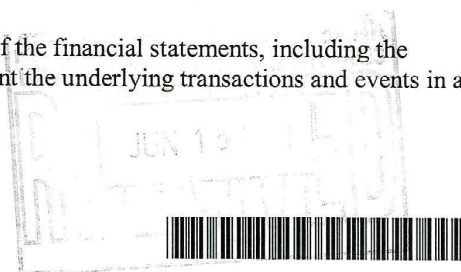
Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the Organization's financial reporting process.

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with PSAs will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

As part of an audit in accordance with PSAs, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Company's internal control.
